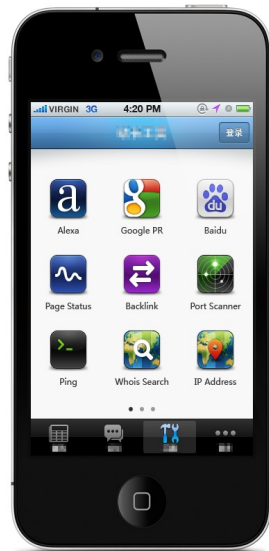

MOBILE APPLICATIONS

Mobile Applications are programs commonly referred to as apps. Apps are downloaded onto cell phones, tablets, I-pads, I-pods, or any other mobile device capable of accessing the internet.

When used correctly, social media can be an enjoyable network. However, as technology becomes easier to access it gives criminals the opportunity to take advantage of or solicit unsuspecting teens. When Social Media is used incorrectly, it can facilitate activities like Sexting, Cyber Bullying, and other distasteful behaviors. Most of these activities alone, with the exception of Sexting, are not illegal, however, these behaviors typically lead to laws being broken. Sexting when a person is under the age of 18 is considered child pornography and is dealt with accordingly.

Mobile Applications typically consist of social media, games, and picture/video sharing networks. Certain apps attempt to give more freedom than outdated chat rooms and allow people to reach out further than ordinarily possible.

Instagram allows you to share images and videos and link those to Facebook, Twitter, and Flickr. These apps require you to set privacy settings, so unless you adjust and maintain the privacy settings to private, it allows any account holder to view your profile. It's important to keep a watchful eye over your children to help make sure they are following safe internet surfing guidelines. By keeping a watchful eye on your child's electronic devices and online activity, you can help prevent online sexual predators from soliciting your children, prevent possible child abductions, and help to keep your child from getting involved in criminal activities.
